The List of Arkansas Birds provides an up-to-date listing of all bird species that have been identified within the state. Based on *Arkansas Birds: Their Distribution and Abundance*, Douglas A. James and Joseph C. Neal, 1986, UA Press plus the card file and online database maintained by the Arkansas Audubon Society, it is intended to supplement the seasonal abundance and distributional information published in the Arkansas Audubon Society Field List by summarizing the supporting documentation available for each species. Taxonomy and nomenclature follow the *Checklist of North American Birds*, American Ornithologists' Union, 1998, as amended through the Fifty-second supplement, July 2011.

As of July 31, 2011, 409 species have been documented within Arkansas. This total includes 4 species (Barnacle Goose, Ash-throated Flycatcher, Varied Thrush and Cassin's Sparrow) added to the state list since the publication of the most recent AAS Field List in 2009. Of that total, specimens, banding data or diagnostic audio/photographic media support 384 species. The remaining 25 species are supported by conclusive written documentation: Brant, Garganey, Common Goldeneye, Ruffed Grouse, Greater Prairie-Chicken (extirpated), Ferruginous Hawk, Black Rail, Whooping Crane (extirpated), Mountain Plover, Eskimo Curlew (extirpated), Purple Sandpiper, Carolina Parakeet (extinct), Lewis's Woodpecker, Cassin's Kingbird, Gray Kingbird, Bank Swallow, Veery, Bohemian Waxwing, Golden-winged Warbler, Black-throated Gray Warbler, Connecticut Warbler, Canada Warbler, Green-tailed Towhee, McCown's Longspur, and White-winged Crossbill.

The supporting documentation available for each species follows its name and is defined as follows:

A-Audio recording

S-Specimen

B-Banding data

W-Written documentation

P-Photographic media (still photo or video)

Additionally, an asterisk "*" is used to denote species that have been extirpated in Arkansas and a dagger "†" is used to denote species that are extinct.

Photographic documentation of rarities is stored at the University of Arkansas (pre-1986 records) or by the current Curator of Bird Records. The bulk of birds collected in Arkansas are housed in the following museums: American Museum of Natural History (New York, New York), Field Museum of Natural History (Chicago, Illinois), University of Kansas Museum of Natural History (Lawrence, Kansas), Louisiana State University Museum of Zoology (Baton Rouge, Louisiana), Harvard Museum of Comparative Zoology (Cambridge, Massachusetts), Royal Ontario Museum (Toronto, Canada), University of Michigan Museum of Zoology (Ann Arbor, Michigan), and the National Museum of Natural History, Smithsonian Institution (Washington, D.C.) Additional specimens are housed at the University of Arkansas Collections (Fayetteville), University of Arkansas at Little Rock Department of Biology and the Arkansas State University Department of Biological Sciences (Jonesboro).

The Arkansas Audubon Society Bird Records Committee is currently comprised of Dick Baxter, Curator of Bird Records, and members Douglas James, Chris Kellner, Charles Mills, and Kenny Nichols.

Future editions will appear following the publication of supplements to the American Ornithologists' Union *Checklist of North American Birds* or as decisions of the Arkansas Bird Records Committee add new species to the state list.
